# Academic Learning

- Literacy: Students continued to work on their word of the day and phonics instruction on digraphs and final blends. Instruction was differentiated to meet individual needs. Students continued their practice and learning on Lexia.
- Reading: Students enjoyed reading First Nation books like "This is my Treaty", "I am Sacred", and more to develop their love for reading.
- Math: Students learned skip counting, addition and subtraction, and measurements. Their Math skills were also enhanced using Symphony Math.
- Social Studies: Students learned important values from the 7 Sacred Teachings. They also shared their biggest dreams for themselves and how they can help in the community.
- Art: Students stepped up their creativity through language arts, winter crafts, drawing/sketching, and painting activities.
- Science: Students explored types of motion (push and pull motions) and connected these to the movements they see around them and to the land.
- Physical Education (Gym): Students practiced running, ball passing and kicking, dribbling and other skills for their coordination and teamwork.
