
Boozhoo from Ms. Lauren & Mr. Shun!

Back to School Activity Week (Sept. 15-19)



Through hybrid lessons, she introduces Indigenous language and culture with fun games, songs, and art. The children love practicing words like "Boozhoo" (Hello), "Miigwech" (Thank you), "Gishatte" (Sunny), and "Dagwaagin" (Fall), building vocabulary and cultural pride. They also enjoy lively Indigenous drumming and storytelling with Orville, joining in rhythmic drumming, puppet shows, hula-hoops, and songs, while our music teacher, Mr. Felipe, adds more fun with creative music and movement activities.
